Most of the questions have Yes or No answers





What words mean

We use some words in this survey which you may not be sure about what they mean. We have printed them in blue and tried to explain them here.



LGBT+ stands for "Lesbian, Gay, Bi-Sexual, Transgender and the + plus sign is for other ways people think of their gender such as queer, asexual, intersex etc.

Lesbian = a woman who is attracted to other women.

Gay = a man who is attracted to other men (some lesbians call themselves gay).

Bisexual = someone attracted to more than one gender.

Transgender = someone who feels their gender is not the same as the sex they were given when born. In this survey trans also means non-binary people.

Non-binary = someone who thinks of their gender not simply as either a man or a woman.

Sex = when you are born, you are classed as male or female. This is decided by what sexual organs you have such as a penis or vagina.

Gender = how male or female someone feels. Gender is not the same as someone's sex. Someone may have been born with the sex organs of a man, but feel they are a woman.

Some people may feel they have no gender, or feel they are somewhere in-between genders, or change genders.
